



The initial foothills of the Pyrenees protect the 11 hectares of Mas Llossanes forming a unique island of vines. at an exceptional altitude up to 700 meters. It is one of the highest vineyard of France. The estate was established in the 1940s, planted on shale soils and granite. Such a terroir bestows its wines with great elegance, freshness and balance. Six autochthonous varietals make up the mosaic of Llossanes: Carignan, Grenache, Syrah, Chenanson, Cinsault and Chasan.



Dominique and Solenn Génot managed a renowned biodynamic winery in Tuscany for over 10 years. The expertise of Dominique, agronomist and oenologist, is perfectly complemented by Solenn, a trained Sommelier. Passion for wine motivated the couple to leave their comfortable employment to tackle the challenge of creating their own domain in 2016. After a very selective search, it is the remarkable terroir of Mas Llossanes that they chose to build their future.

Since our arrival, the vineyard has benefitted from organic and biodynamic viticulture. Chemical products are banned. We remove weeds by plowing and we often polish with a pickaxe. The grapes are hand-harvested exclusively. In the cellar, we embrace the same respectful philosophy. The fermentations are leaded by indigenous yeasts. We only add sulfites when necessary, and always at a minimum. We give our wines the time they need to refine and stabilize, without fining or clarification.

2016 Mas Llossanes Au Dolmen

Scents of crushed stone and red fruit mark the nose of the 2016 Au Dolmen, a blend of 73% Carignan, 15% Syrah and 12% Chenanson (an indigenous variety) from high-altitude granitic vineyards in the Fenouillèdes region. It's medium-bodied and taut, with a fine line of acidity running throughout, modest tannins and a crisp, dry finish.

2017 Mas Llossanes IGP Côtes Catalanes Au Dolmen

Mainly old-vine Carignan planted at up to 600 meters above sea level, the 2017 IGP Côtes Catalanes Au Dolmen aged in used oak. It features peppery accents on the red fruited nose, then delivers tart red berries on the medium-bodied palate. It's marked by its altitude and just-ripe flavors, with bright acids lingering tartly on the finish.

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2019 Mas Llossanes IGP Côtes Catalanes Lâ-Haut

A naturally made Carignan (certified organic, indigenous yeasts, no sulfur added), the 2019 IGP Côtes Catalanes Lâ-Haut is a bright, red-fruited wine. It comes out of the bottle with hints of sewer gas, but they blow off quickly, leaving behind crunchy berries, nearly invisible tannins and bright acidity. Decant this medium-bodied wine and glug it down with roast chicken or burgers off the grill over the next year or so.

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2016 Mas Llossanes Dotera

Floral and fresh, with hints of violets, crushed stone and vibrant red fruit, the 2016 Dotera is a blend of 40% Carignan, 30% Grenache, 16% Chenanson (an ancient, indigenous variety) and 14% Syrah from granitic, high-altitude vineyards. It tastes of its terroir more than of a single variety, showing crunchy red berries, medium body, a fine tension between acidity and ripeness and a long, crisp finish. This is a relatively new estate, well worth



It's medium to full-bodded, silky yet firm on the palate, finishing mountiwatering and ong, like the Au Dolimen bottling, the wine is defined by its altitude and vibrant acids.

Old vines Carignan blended with a little Syrah and Chenanson. Youthful crimson ruby. quite fine and concentrated blueberry fruit on the nose and succulent red fruit on the palate. Hints of garrigue and spice on the finish. Dominique Génot's signature elegance has been built into this wine. Seamless as well as easygoing. (WS)

Mas Llossanes, Dotrera 2017 IGP Côtes 17.5 Catalanes This wine is pure joy and even more remarkable knowing it is from the boiling hot 2017 vintage. Old vines Top 3 wines from this producer Carignan and Grenache on 600m have done their best to mitigate the heat as have done Solenn and Dominique Génot who run the property. Dark ruby. Mas Llossanes, Dotrera 2016 IGP Côtes Catalanes

Score 17.5/20

New project of Dominique Génot, winemaker at Caiarossa, and his wife Solenn, in Roussillon, where they acquired the highest vineyard in the region between 550 and 650m with a total of 11ha of old gobelet or bush vines all cultivated biodynamically. Carignan dominated blend with a little Grenache grown on granite soils at 600m of altitude. Youthful ruby. An intriguing brooding nose of dark fruit and what looks like a hint of oak. Elegant yet holding back and a little less immediate than the Au Dolmen, but with the same elegant, suave built, velvety tannins and layers and layers of depth. Impressive results for this estate's first vintage. (WS)



Mas Llossanes, Pur Rosé Cinsault 2017 IGP Côtes Catalanes

Score 17+/20

New project of Dominique Génot, former winemaker at Caiarossa (Tuscany), and his wife Solenn in Roussillon, where they acquired the highest vineyard in the region at between 550 and 650 m with a total of 11 ha of old gobelet bush vines all cultivated biodynamically. The soil, consisting of granite and schist, in combination with the high altitude results in delicate and aromatic wines. This is Dominique and Solenn's first vintage. 100% Cinsault.

Pale strawberry. Class as well as concentration on the nose with wild strawberry, notes of garrigue, frozen raspberry coulis and iron. Viscous and full yet not heavy. A spurt of acidity on a long, complex finish. Pour this in large burgundy glasses, it truly needs space to expand and open up, as well as fine seafood. (WS)

Mas Llossanes 2016 Dotrera Red (Côtes Catalanes)

Scents of forest-floor berries, wet foliage, pressed carnation and whole cardamom form the nose of this red blend. It's smooth and silky on entry, but then somewhat raw. Medium tannins lend a surprisingly grippy frame that endures through the close and overrides the fruit tones.

Mas Llossanes 2016 Au Dolmen Red (Côtes Catalanes)

Bold berry aromas and a meaty accent form the nose of this dark red, with additional hints of bramble and mentholated herbs. It's medium in weight, but soft and somewhat flat on the midpalate, with ample acidity to partner with the tart red cherry, currant and strawberry tones and lend freshness through the finish.



Dominique et Solenn Génot ont repris en 2016 ce vignoble d'environ 10 hectares, situé face au Canigou sur un secteur encore très sauvage, entre 600 et 700 mètres d'altitude. Actuellement en conversion bio avec une certification acquise dès le millésime 2019, ils travaillent leurs vignes avec attention et labourent notamment au cheval. En plus des cépages classiques de la région, une rareté s'épanouit ici : le cépage chasan. Produit en toute petite quantité, c'est une perle rare donnant un blanc lumineux qui surprend par sa fraîcheur et sa tension remarquable. Solenn et Dominique Génot du domaine du mas Llossanes récompensés

Concours vignerons. 2e prix pour le mas Llossanes.

Dernièrement, à Paris, Antoine Leccia, président du directoire d'AdVini et Anne-Lucie Wack, directrice générale de Montpellier SupAgro ont remis à trois lauréats les prix du Concours vignerons et terroirs d'avenir. Par cet événement, ils souhaitent encourager le développement de l'activité vinicole en soutenant des projets respectueux de l'environnement et en mettant en lumière des hommes, un terroir, des traditions. Le 2e prix de 20 000 € a été remporté par Solenn et Dominique Génot.

Après des études en œnologie et viticulture, Dominique a été gérant d'un domaine viticole en Toscane. Solenn a appris sur le terrain le travail en vigne, en cave et a suivi une formation de sommelier en Italie. Dix ans après, en 2016, ils ont repris à leur compte le domaine du mas Llossanes situé à cheval dans les communes de Tarérach et Arboussols à 20 km de Perpignan. Situé entre 600 et 700 m d'altitude, ce vignoble de montagne, face au Canigou, est un des plus hauts de France. Sur des arènes granitiques, terroirs issus de schistes Solenn et Dominique pratiquent la culture biologique et depuis 2017, la biodynamique (aucun désherbant, engrais verts et une démarche en cours par rapport du travail à cheval).
